As part of the learning experience, Summer Institute participants will spend Saturday morning visiting San Francisco neighborhoods where migrants from around the world now call home. The tour will include a presentation at the San Francisco AIDS Foundation (SFAF) and a visit to Strut, a health and wellness center in the Castro neighborhood, serving the lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and queer (LGBTQ) community. **Important: Tour will be mainly by public transportation and by foot.**
